

#### History.

In 1977 Endeavour Hills was very new with a population of less than 2000. It was a community with limited resources, 5-year plans for future action, but with needs that were immediate. One concerned resident, Carl Willmore, with the backing of the Lyndale Methodist (later Uniting) Church, visited the homes, assessed the needs and began processes to meet these.

A major need was to connect people and break down isolation. Small support groups began which grew into "share and care" groups. Fellowship and bible study groups in homes developed in response to a call for a Christian presence. During 1979 and 1980 the community of faith met in the James Cook Primary School.

A house was built in Matthew Flinders Avenue for community activities, worship and Sunday School and was known as "The Community House". In 1986 all of those activities moved to a multi-purpose building at the current address. The Uniting Church building incorporates a Childcare Centre. The Neighbourhood Centre moved to other premises in 2001.
