I would like to extend my heartfelt thanks to all the 'beloved saints' at the Endeavour Hills Uniting Church for their kindness, prayers and cards, on the passing of my mother 'Wanda Ciolek' on 24th April 2016, aged 89. DOB 14th June 1926. Here is some of her story if you are interested. My parents were Germans and lived in Germany until 1953 when we migrated to Australia on a **legal** immigration ship after being accepted through a stringent application process in Germany by the Australian Government, as post war immigrants to Australia. I think it was the 'White Australia Policy' then.

German citizens were persecuted by the Nazi regime and were executed summarily if they said anything against Hitler. All citizens were required to report any adverse comments or behaviours to the Gestapo. My mother related to us that once as a young girl she had made some innocent remark and was reported by an acquaintance. She managed to survive the event. My father was sent to Russia to fight during WW2 without adequate clothing and provision for the harsh Russian winters as reported in allied history. This led to the defeat of the German army when the Russians utilised their Siberian snow skiers to attack the Germans bogged down in the mud and slush with their frozen equipment, oil and petrol. My father was shot in the leg in Russia and limped for the rest of his life.

The German population was starving during the war (WW2). Bombing and destruction from the allies combined with persecution and murder from the Nazi regime left so many homeless and bereft of food and shelter. Swarms of destitute people would come and invade your home whether you liked it or not. My mother was often forced to sleep in some fruit crates as she was evicted from her bed. My grandparents lived in a rural village and so were at least able to grow a few potatoes

and some vegetables to eat which were often stolen. Arriving in Australia with three small children and a small box of personal possessions created hunger, poverty and very hard times. There were no government handouts in 1953. It was find work or starve.

Growing with my family dynamics has been very painful and scarring. Joyce Rupp has written a wonderful piece regarding:

'Old Injuries of the Heart.'

We all have them. They claim a lot of our energy at times. It may be the person who never liked us, or the one who destroyed us with jealousy or untruths, or the one who wiped us out with silence. It may be the relative who started the fight or the parent who abused us verbally or physically. We must let go of our sinfulness. It is very hard to accept our own weaknesses or our failures and to trust in the mercy and forgiveness of God. (Rupp 2009, p. 82).

The weeks prior to and after my mother's passing were difficult for me. I was coping with work dynamics, family dynamics and mother's death. Work had to continue, family matters were paramount and the Wednesday morning Bible Study Group provided support and normalcy. Supervisors at work ordered time out for self-care. My work at the hospital is church work every day on the job. Sunday had to be my only day of rest and recuperation.

I wish to give especial thanks for the prayers and cards from the congregation. This includes you ALL; Kerri and Jeff; Judy; Gwen and Gavin; Andrew, Elizabeth and Daniel; Tim and Olive; and Jean for her Pastoral Care.

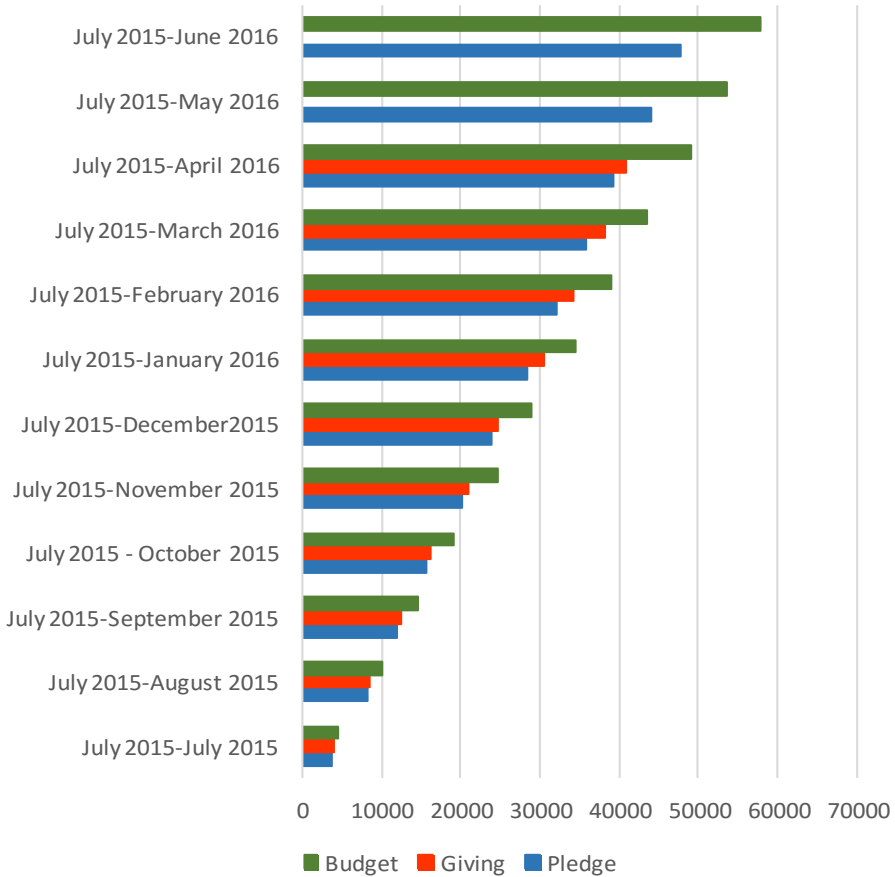

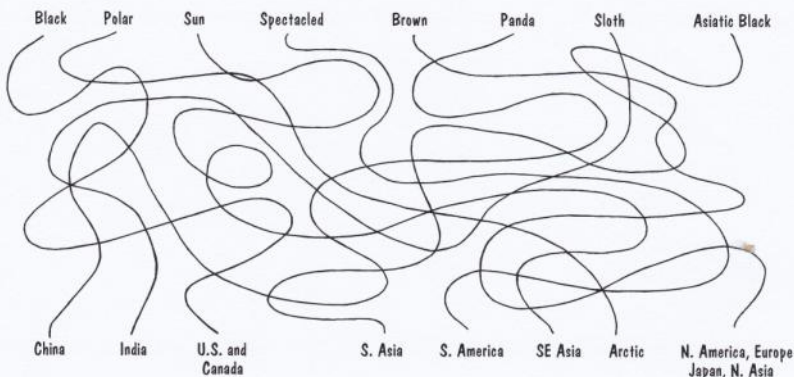

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

What an incredible joy and privilege to write in this issue of Interact as your minister. I feel so privileged and blessed to be here and it is a real answer to prayer. Who would have believed when I first preached as a random supply minister many Sundays ago, that God in his sovereignty and perfect plan would call me to Endeavour Hills UC.

As many of you will know, I am passionate and committed to growing disciples of Jesus Christ who will impact and transform the world. I absolutely believe that if we can build disciples, we **WILL** build a church. Discipleship at its heart is all about knowing and following Christ and this is done by embedding ourselves in Christ. One of things you will find me constantly saying is that Christianity is not a religion, it is a relationship both with God and others. He is the model of our becoming the Father. In him the fullness of God dwells. All knowledge of God resides in him; all glory of God remains in him; all the power of God belongs to him. His unity with the Father is so intimate and so complete that to see Jesus is to see the Father. "Show us the Father," Philip says to him. Jesus responds, "Anyone who has seen me has seen

the Father."

We are now companions on the journey and only God can completely see the road ahead. Undoubtedly there will be many joys and challenges we will experience together but I know that in God's grace & power, we will have an exciting adventure together. May our hearts be like Bilbo Baggins from the movie, "The Hobbit" who runs out of his village shouting, "I am going on an adventure!"

SHEMA YISRAEL, ADONAI ELOHEINU, ADONAI ECHAD

Hear O'Israel, the Lord our God is one God (Lord)

Shema is the greatest prayer in the Jewish prayerbook called the Siddhur. Jewish families recite the Shema early morning when they wake up and again in the evening before they retire to rest.

We see the similarity in the Christian Bible not in the form of a recital, but during our daily devotions we learn from Scripture.

“Hear, O' Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates”. Deuteronomy 6: 4-9.

In Hebrew the word 'Shema' is to hear, a Jewish confession of faith recited twice daily by religious Jews. The Lord God divinely reveals here that there is only one God, when many Jews worshipped other gods like Baal worship. The Lord's love for His people is eternal and here expects complete, unbridled, total love from their innermost being. To pray is a commandment from our Lord. “Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus”. 1 Thessalonians 5: 16-18 “Pray in the Spirit on all occasions and with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the saints”. Ephesians 6:18 In this verse Paul realised the lack of interest or concern of Christians about prayer and its neglect. How often do we pray or rather how seldom we pray? How often the church and the congregation engage in a great blessing in prayer? Then let it go, become lethargic and stop prayer altogether. Why is this need for prayer constant, importunate, persistent, unceasing, prevailing, overcoming prayer a command from the Lord? Because we live in a world where Satan is very active in deceiving Christians just as he did in the Garden of Eden. The Bible is clear when we read the Armour of God the complete verses in Ephesians 6: 10-20 and Ephesians 6: 12 about our struggles. The devil is deceitful, cunning, he never rests, continually scheming to destroy the

the saints of God. When we relax in our prayer life, the devil succeeds. When we pray we receive blessings from God. The reason we lack many things in life is because we neglect our prayer to God. James 4:2. In Mark 1:35 and Luke 6:12 Lord Jesus spent the night in prayer before selecting the 12 apostles.

Hebrews 7:25 speaks of the Lord Jesus as the perfect High Priest forever. We need to be transcendent in our prayer life, meaning beyond the range of belief and earthy experience. As breathing is a physical reality, to spend time in prayer needs to be a reality. We know that the law of the reflex nervous system controls our breathing, the animate nature God has created us, When we pray without ceasing, we experience transcendence beyond our experience. We read of the repeated intercession of Abraham for the salvation of Sodom and Gomorrah, showed an early example of the necessity and the benefit derived from importunate praying in Genesis 19. Jacob wrestled all night with Angel Gabriel, shows the power and perseverance in praying. Moses prayed forty days and forty nights for Israel. Elijah repeated and urged his prayer seven times until rain clouds appeared above the horizon. (it did not rain for three years) Daniel prayed for three weeks before God answered his prayer. Our Lord Jesus in Gethsemane presented His case three times with unabated, urgent and submissive importunate prayer, with every element of His soul with tears and sweat with drops of blood.

The parable of the widow who prayed importunately is a classic example of insistent prayer. It was a petition to an unjust judge to avenge her adversary. Luke 18:1-8 The Syrophoenician woman who came to our Lord pleading to heal her daughter. This was a woman clinging to her faith by importunate prayer, which won her victory. Mark 7: 24-30 Hannah's womb was closed and she could not have children. Hannah prayed unceasingly and God answered her prayers with the birth of a son Samuel, who was a prophet. 1 Samuel 1:16 "In that day you will no longer ask Me anything. I tell you the truth, My Father will give you whatever you ask in My Name. Until now you have not asked for anything in My Name. Ask and you will receive, and your joy will be complete". John 16: 23-24.
