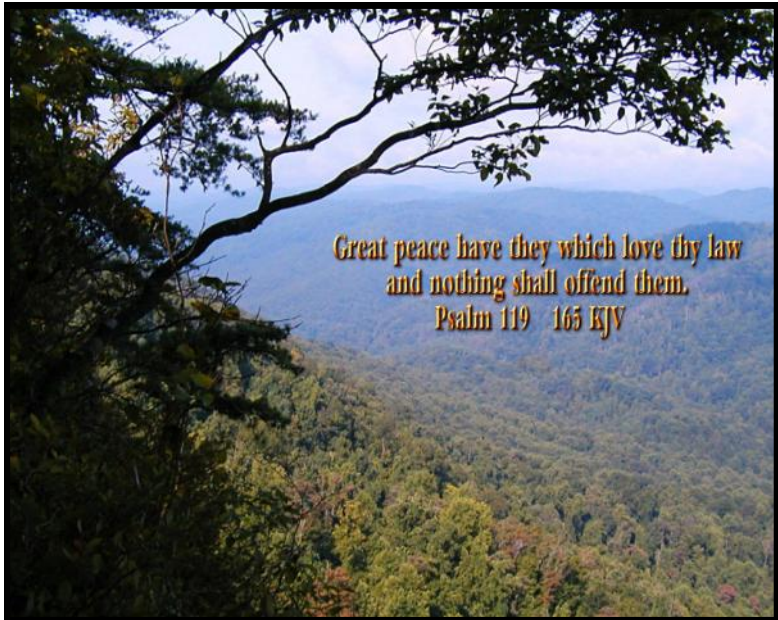

The Cure for the Sin Nature

The good news is that Christ's sacrifice supplies spiritual life for any person who calls on the name of the Lord for salvation. Paul says, "For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life" Romans 5:10) The Apostle also highlights this spiritual regeneration when he writes, "Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creature; the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come" (2 Corinthians 5:17)

The Spirit of God takes up residence in each person who is born again and supplies the power to not only defeat the effects of the sin nature, but to supply strength to defeat the old sinful nature's pull to do wrong in God's sight. Paul says it like this: "But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not carry out the desire of the flesh" (Galatians 5: 16-17)

The great news is that the sin nature can be defeated by the One who did not inherit a sin nature from His earthly parents (Jesus was born of a virgin). Through His finished work on the cross, Jesus, being sinless, satisfied God's wrath for sinners and rose again to offer life to those devoid of spiritual life.

In conclusion, the fact that each person ever born possesses a sin nature is verified by human experience and the Word of God. The good news is that Christ provides a way of conquering the inherited sin nature and a victory that can be experienced both in this life and the next. No matter how bad off the person is, Jesus can defeat the sin that enslaves him.

12th February 2014

Devotions led by Lauleti

Ministers report. Lauleti thanked council for allowing him, Molisi and Hayden to attend NCYC. Molisi and Hayden to report on their experiences during our service on 23rd February. The services at Craigcare Aged Facility conducted by Lauleti, Olive and Ineke will continue this year but on the second Tuesday each month, not on a Monday which is Lauleti's day off. There will be 2 baptisms on the 4th Sunday in March. The babies are Sesita, son of Tavita and Marina Tualii and Christopher – Sione son of George and Finau Manuofetoa.

Property and Finance. Having some difficulty getting fencing contractors to come and quote on fencing. Need to decide whether to accept the one quote received. Several repairs in progress.

Childcare area. A group of Church Council and Property and Finance members met with some of the Jesuran Healing group to discuss the possibility of their group making further use of the childcare space and our church area. A timetable has been drawn up and financial arrangements are to be finalised. The programs they run are for newly arrived immigrants and include counselling, music and computer training. They have counsellors with appropriate qualifications. Presbytery will also be using the childcare office and former nursery for some time.

Sunday School. Will be able to use part of the child care space. Sunday school is proving difficult due to the wide range of ages, abilities and interests of the small group of children.

Fundraising The fundraising group together with our families from the Philippines are planning a dinner to raise funds for the Philippines following the hurricane last year. This will be held on 29th March at Dandenong North.

A Moment with Lauleti

Season of Lent: A Time of Making Life-Giving Choices!

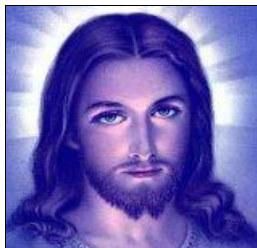
Lent Season is a time of journeying and following – with Jesus' earthly story not only journeying towards Jerusalem where Jesus will fulfill the salvation process of humankind, but also journeying deep within ourselves – to test and consolidate our faith. And this journey may bring various experiences that stretch and challenge, or times that frustrate and make us stumble. There are always choices to be made, reinforce, refocus and recommit.

This is what the *Seasons of the Spirit* worship material for Lent 2014 describes about the gospel lectionary reading for first Sunday in Lent - Matthew 4:1-11. This background information may assist us in our Lenten Journey choices.

Matthew 4:1-11, Jesus has just experienced a spiritual high point. Jesus has been baptized by John and confirmed as the beloved child of God.

How does Jesus respond to that affirmation? We are told that he is led by God's Spirit into the wilderness to be tested.

Wilderness is a time of seeking, journeying, and struggling with the possibilities, impossibilities and miracles. It is a powerful image in the Hebrew Scriptures: the people of Israel and the prophets Elijah and Elisha all had wilderness experiences that forced them into making choices and decisions. It is as if Jesus is faced with the same tests as the people of Israel when Moses led them out of Egypt. The role of the devil here is much

like the role of Satan in the book of Job – a tester, rather than an inherently evil being. In fact, Jesus addresses the devil as Satan. It seems to be a war of words, using the Torah as a weapon; but the questions are vital. Satan appeals to self-interest: “If [or ‘since’] you are the Son of God”...you can do what you like. Jesus replies with the principle, “It is written.” The Torah, the way of living with God, is the touchstone.

Each temptation or test Jesus faces increases in complexity, from the physical needs of hunger in the wilderness, to the possibilities of political and religious power in Jerusalem, to the mountaintop where one might meet with God. Should he use his power to feed himself, to draw people to his cause by miracle working, or perhaps use undue influence to bring change? Jesus relies on the grace of God to rebuff Satan and to choose wisely.

Wilderness times come to us in many ways. The place of testing and self-exploration may be physical or spiritual. When we are taken to the places of our vulnerability, we can find deserts, mountains and oceans of the soul even in crowded cities. Who am I as a beloved son or daughter of God? What are my rights and responsibilities? What are my limits and choices? Where do I put my trust? These stretching and testing times strengthen us on our faith journeys.

Wilderness times are times of challenge and possibility, where we may be stretched to our limits or need to make far-reaching decisions. Knowing who to trust and having clear guidelines helps us make wise choices.

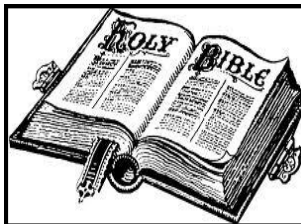
When are the times you find you must test or stretch your boundaries?

It is my prayer and hope that the God of the Lenten Journey meets us in the wilderness places of our lives, where we are stretched and tested. May the God of Journey walk with you and hold you on the pathway, grant you wisdom and flexibility that you may grow in grace and love and enable you to make the inspiring **life-giving choices!**

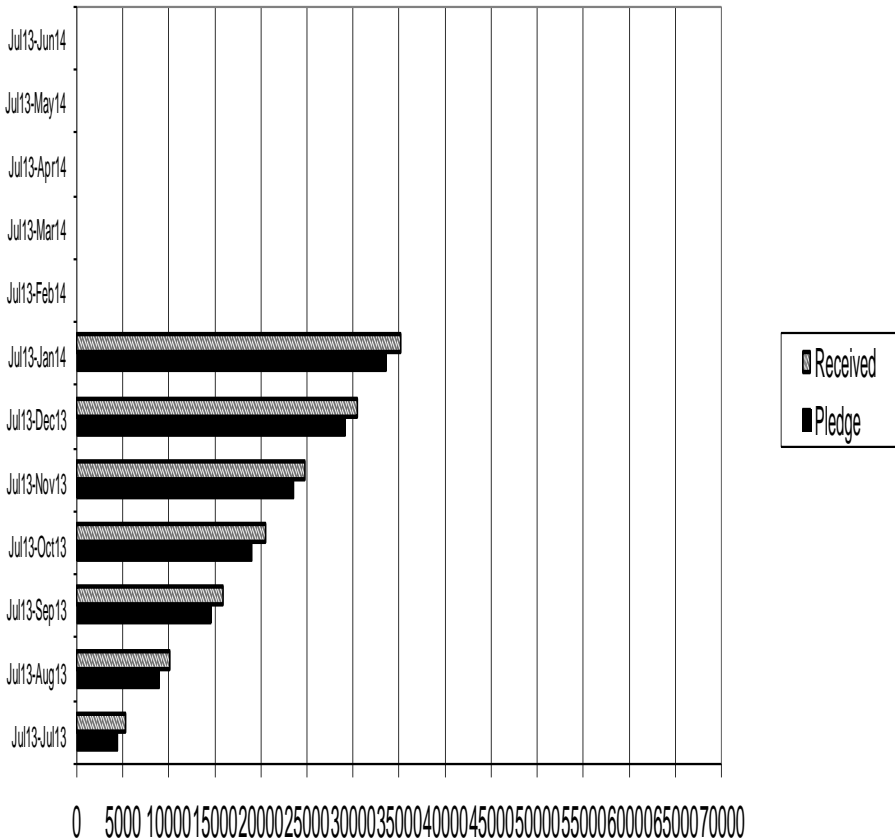

HISTORY OF EHUC CHILD CARE

Endeavour Hills Uniting Church Child Care. 27 years service.

It all began in 1983 when land was purchased. A Government Capital Grant of \$165,000 for the Childcare part of the building followed . Then in March 1986 the Childcare began with Janine Ashton there from that beginning. Kath Mellowdew joined in 1988.

Janine had become Co-ordinator in 1997. After her second child was born she and Kath shared the Co-ordinator's role right until now.

In those early days the Centre was guided by Synod's Early Childhood Unit (Consultant Joy Williams). Come 1997 the Government took away the Operational Subsidy of \$25,000 per annum which made challenges.

Dianne Hall joined the staff in 2001 and worked for over 10 years. Throughout the many years the centre has always maintained its High Quality Accreditation. Well done!

In July 2005 Synod told Connections they were to take over the management of UC Kindergartens and Childcare Centres. It was somewhat problematic for a while because the two were quite different.

Prior to this time, Geoff Lacey had joined the Childcare Management Committee in 1997. Over the years he has organized Working Bees for Church Folk and Childcare Parents for compliance with changing regulations. Then in 2005 he and Catherine Gonzalves formed an Advisory Committee of 3 people with Geoff as Co-ordinator, Stan Ashley looking at finances and working on computers and myself doing gardening.

HISTORY OF EHUC CHILD CARE

But generally, Geoff was Mr Fixit saving the Centre hundreds/thousands of dollars. His hours would have been huge. Work was done inside to keep up with regulations. The outside play areas of grass and tanbark have been replaced by softfall rubber and artificial grass. Fences have been replaced or made higher and retaining walls replaced. Sandpits have been moved many times. Security Systems were installed. More recently floor coverings and blinds were replaced .

In the last few years enrolments have been down due to the competition of many Childcare Centres in Endeavour Hills. With low enrolments in a small centre and new regulations in 2011 requiring a Kinder Teacher be employed in the next 2 years, as well as changes to staff ratios, it was timely, and in discussion with Connections, our Church Council agreed to close the centre after so many years.

It is sad to do so after good relationships on the shared site. We thank the Staff for the magnificent job they have done. Janine, Kath and staff, after 27 and 25 years respectively, you have served very professionally with great caring as well as providing a varied program, all to the benefit of the children and their parents.

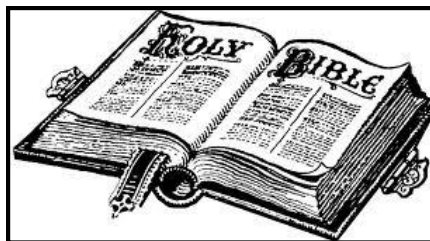

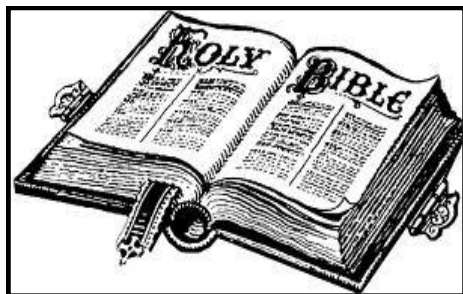

SAMMY STAMP



Sammy Stamp is the logo for the UCAF Special Needs Fund – Stamps, which provides grants for small projects not covered in the Synod Budget. Funds are raised by sale of used stamps and Met tickets collected from churches, business houses and other organisations.

The stamps are collected, sorted, trimmed, packaged and sold by an enthusiastic group of around 40 volunteers who meet at the Synod Centre each Thursday.

Originally begun by the Presbyterian Women's Missionary Union the fund became a project of the Uniting Church Adult Fellowship following Church Union in 1977. That year \$4,760 was raised. In 2006 a staggering \$33,190 was raised. This included \$11,270 for a special Australia stamp sold at auction.

In 2012 \$42,616 was raised. Grants were made to many projects including:-

Mission Liaison Group - towards the transport costs of sending charitable goods overseas (\$2,000)

Frontier Services - towards replacing outdoor furniture at Rocky Ridge Age Care Facility Northern Territory (\$3,000)

Uniting World - towards training maternal health workers in South Sudan (\$2,500)

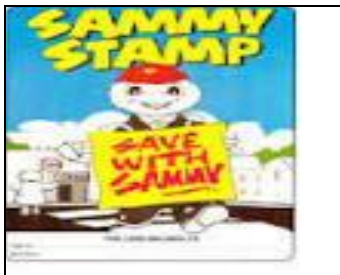
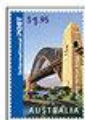

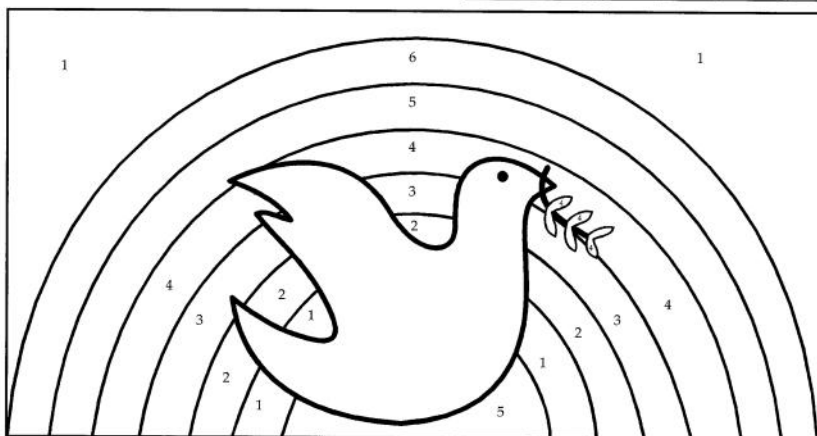
