# The Montessori Method

**T**he Montessori Method is an approach to education developed by Dr Maria Montessori based on her studies of children from birth to adolescence. It is a child centred approach which continues to stand the test of time. It is very highly regarded and practised today with great success in many diverse cultures throughout the world. One very recent example; Britain's young Prince George is beginning his formal early learning at a Montessori school in London.

The Montessori method of education provides children with a stimulating and engaging learning environment using unique resources designed to support the child's learning at each stage of their development. The unique resources and the specific training of the teacher is the key to successful Montessori education.

Young children develop their cognitive powers through direct sensory motor experiences, this is fundamental to all children's development no matter where in the world they find themselves. It is the same for a child of the twenty-first century as it was for one who was born a hundred years ago! Consequently the focus in the early years is on all the senses; seeing, hearing, tasting, smelling, touching and movement.

The resources are presented in sequential order, starting from the simple and moving through to the more complex. Children only move on to the next task when they have mastered the previous one. The children always work at their own pace. They can work individually or in small groups. Once they have been shown a specific resource they are free to use it for as long as they feel the need. They will move on when they are ready. The Montessori



teacher will always be ready to provide support for the child's next step.

The Montessori method of education offers a respectful, caring and attractive learning environment for the child. It meets the social, emotional, intellectual, physical and spiritual needs of the child.

The Montessori classroom or home tutoring environment, nurtures each child's individual strengths, needs and interests. It helps build a strong foundation for each child which will help support them throughout their lives.

Montessori education is suitable for any child at any time. Children flourish in the Montessori environment whether they are excelling or whether they need a little extra support because it is designed to meet their individual needs.

Montessori Education has touched the lives of a large and diverse range of people, many of them famous individuals. Former Montessori students known for their initiative, creativity, and self confidence include Google founders Larry Page and Sergey Brin, co-founder of Facebook Mark Zuckerberg, Amazon.com founder Jeff Bezos, Wikipedia founder Jimmy Wales, Nobel Prize winner Gabriel Garcia Marquez, Prince William and Prince Harry.

# EMPOWERED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT

Continuing from my previous article on the 'Promise of the Holy Spirit', it is significant to observe the work of the Holy Spirit. Foremost of the graces starts with love, as in 2 Corinthians 5:14. In Galatians the fruit of the Spirit begins with love. Of the nine different graces mentioned here, Saint Paul puts love at the head of the list. Galatians 5:22. All the other graces mentioned may be included in 'love'. Love is at the beginning, at the end and all the way through these graces. We cannot produce this love by ourselves, but only through the Holy Spirit. Verse 23 concludes of the nine graces, "Against such things there is no law". 1 John 4:8 God is Love. Verse 16 "And we know and rely on the love God has for us". When we are empowered by the Holy spirit, God will use us for His divine purposes.

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". Matthew 28:19. The Holy Spirit and the Son are equal with the Father. They are One with the Sovereign Lord God. In verse 18 Lord Jesus says "all authority in heaven and earth are given to Me". All authority means supreme power to do anything. The 3 significant sayings of the Lord Jesus are 1) All authority means all power in heaven and earth is given to Him. 2) Go to all nations and 3) Teach the Gospel in verse 20 "teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you, And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age". If we have not been taught everything the Lord has commanded, then we lack in our knowledge of Scripture. We need to plead with the Holy Spirit to teach us everything and be our Guide. When we do that the Holy Spirit will impress our hearts and seal the preached Word. "But when He, the Spirit of truth, comes, He will guide you into all truth, He will not speak on His own; He will speak only what He hears, and He will tell you what is yet to come, He will bring glory to Me by taking from what is Mine, and making it known to you. All that belongs to the Father is Mine, that is why I said the Spirit will take from what is Mine and make it known to you". John 16: 13 -15. It is not only these 3 verses we read about the work of the Holy Spirit. But also in Luke we read about a holy and righteous man named Simeon and the Holy Spirit was upon him. Luke 2: 25 - 30. Simeon was moved by the Spirit when he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do the ritual according to the Law required by Jewish custom, Simeon took Him in his arms and praised God. The Holy spirit had revealed to him that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Christ. Luke was a Gentile who spoke the truth that salvation was



offered to both Gentiles as well as for Jews ( verse 32 ). In 2 Peter 1: 20 - 21 where holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit. The work of the Holy Spirit can be seen from Genesis to Revelation. The first five books of the Bible called the Pentateuch from Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy, revealed by God that guided the hand of Moses to write them, through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is a Person and not an attribute, force, or influence coming from God. “and I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Counsellor to be with you forever”. John14:16. “But the Counsellor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My Name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you” John 14: 26. “And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out His love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom He has given us”. Romans 5:5. The believer’s hope is based on God’s love which is revealed to us by the Holy Spirit. Saint Paul preached from faith to hope and to love in 1 Corinthians 13:13. Saint Paul continues “We continually remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labour prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. No person can be a co-worker with God without love. “May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit”. John 15:13

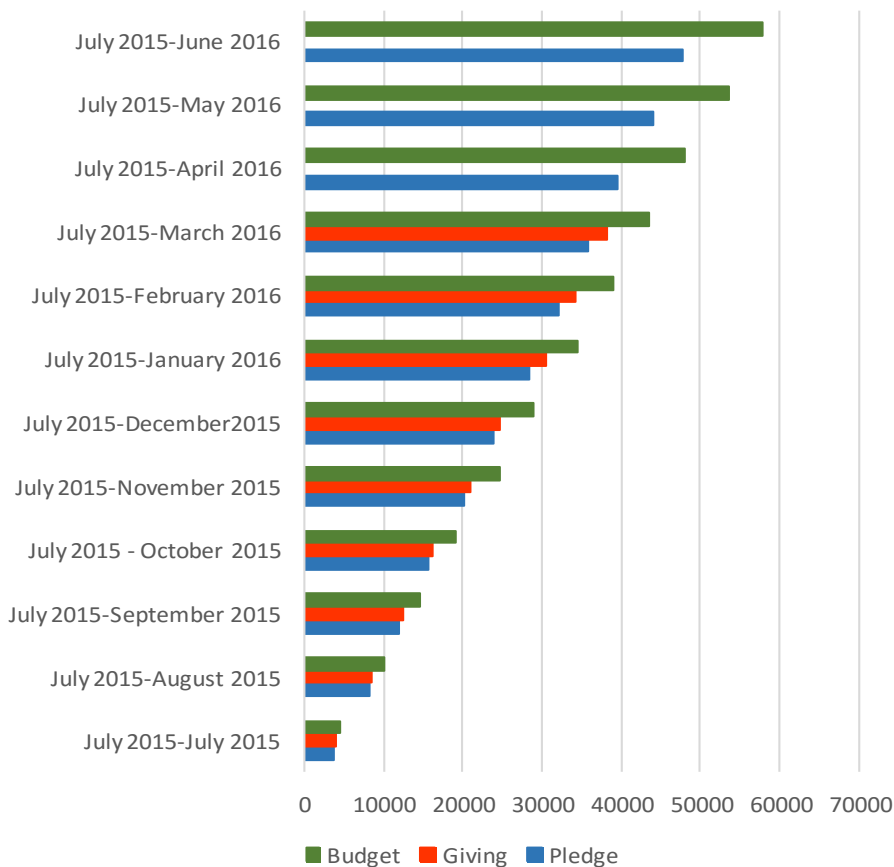

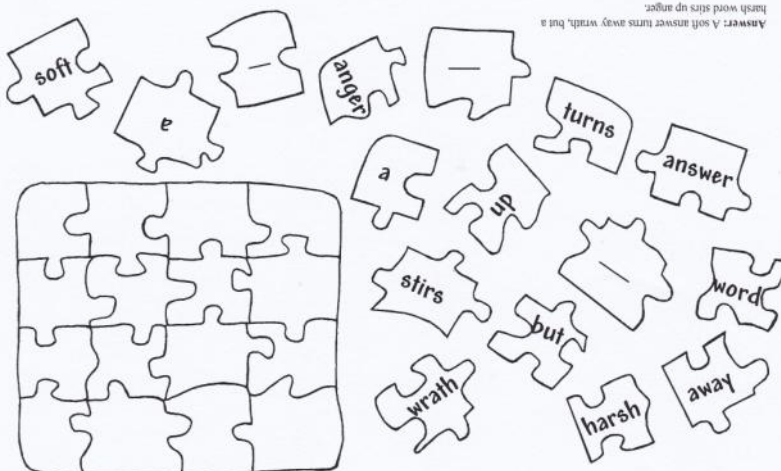
