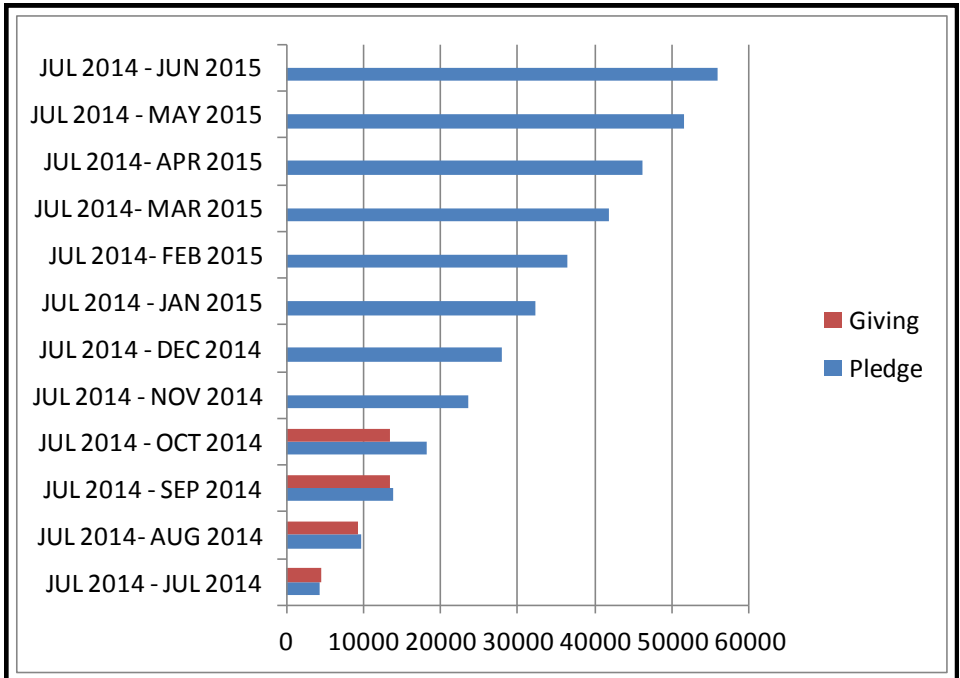

TRUE WORSHIPPERS WORSHIP IN SPIRIT AND TRUTH

"Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshippers the Father seeks. God is Spirit, and His worshippers must worship in spirit and in truth." John 4: 23-24

The woman of Samaria met our Lord Jesus at the Jacob's well, the first time He spoke about prayer. The Father seeks true worshippers, who worship in spirit and truth and our Lord showed us the way to worship God. He spoke of three kinds of worshippers. First the people who worship but do not know who they worship. Second the intellectual or the intelligent worship of Jews and Gentiles who know who they worship. The third is the spiritual worship of God in spirit and in truth, which does not mean a prayer from the heart earnestly and sincerely. Jews who knew God from their understanding of the Pentateuch, called on God with their whole hearts, but not in "spirit and truth". Only through our Lord Jesus we can worship God in spirit and truth.

Even to this day we find these three classes of worshippers and some who do not know what they need and ask for. Praying with all our hearts and minds earnestly with great vigour, does not mean we worship in spirit and truth. We may pray much but without much fruit, blessings or answers we expect, because we do not pray in spirit and truth. We know that God is a Spirit and we who pray must pray in spirit and truth. There is a necessity to have a direct line of communication between the worshipper and God. It means our spirit must connect with the Spirit of God, in complete agreement and harmony. To do this the worshipper must get his heart into such a state that he has no will of his own in regard to his worship, meaning the Spirit of God is in complete harmony with his spirit.



The Samaritan woman asked the Lord the place of true worship, whether in Samaria or Jerusalem. He answered her that the place of worship is not confined to a particular place. God is an infinite Spirit not limited by space or time. Therefore our worship must be spiritual, not confined only to the church and a certain time. Our worship must come from God Himself being Spirit, only He can give His Spirit to us by giving the Holy Spirit. In our worship in the spirit we cry "Abba Father" worshipping the Father in the Spirit of Christ. We can worship God only if the Holy Spirit dwells in our hearts. Worship in spirit and truth has a higher Divine meaning and does not mean genuine, heartfelt, sincere worship and according to the Word of God. Jesus said "I am the truth and the life" He is the only begotten Son of God full of grace and truth. The Holy Spirit, Jesus sent us is the spirit of truth and we receive the grace that is in Him to us. So when we worship in spirit, we worship in truth. When we have intimate fellowship with God who is Spirit we are connected to Him through our spirit. Therefore we must first understand and then offer an acceptable worship that is pleasing to Him. The mere utterance or babbling of words in our prayer and worship, though it may give us a false sense of self satisfaction that we worshipped God in prayer, may not be true worship acceptable to Him.

The secret of worship in spirit and truth is to know the Divine nature of God and His infinite Godliness in our hearts. The revelation of His infinite love for us through our faith in Him. We need Christ and His Spirit dwelling in our hearts revealing the almighty God, making us true worshippers in spirit and truth.

PRAYER: IS KNOWING GOD

It is important that we do not neglect any aspect of prayer though a definition prevails as to the sequence of prayer in, Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving and Supplication (ACTS). They spell out activities in prayer, elements of praying. But the **essence of prayer is knowing God and coming into His presence**. We do not pray to get what we want from God, but it is **our pursuit of seeking His will and our desire to align ourselves with His will**.

In a theology of prayer, not consisting of a rules-keeping agenda, I believe the following as basic requisites for prayer.

Recognising God's Grace, keeping faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, walking in the light, listening to the Spirit's voice, loving all people, resisting Satan, surrendering to the will of God and persevering to the end.

The law was given through Moses, grace and truth were realised through Jesus Christ. That is why Apostle Paul opened his letters with the salutation "Grace to you and peace from God our Father". The grace of God makes us true disciples who are worthy to pray with strong assurance that God hears and God answers. The prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

The writer of the Hebrews says "without faith it is impossible to please God, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who seek Him" Heb. 11:6

Total surrender of self to the Lord Jesus is the secret to answered prayer. He withdrew His suggestion of His own plan and accepted the will of His Father. That is the key to our victory too, being in the Father's will.

In March 1895, George Muller of Bristol, England, wrote:

"I never remember, in all my Christian course, a period now of sixty-nine years and four months, that I ever sincerely and patiently sought to know the will of God by the teaching of the Holy Ghost, through the instrumentality of the Word of God, but I have been always directed rightly. But if honesty of heart, and uprightness before God were lacking, or if I did not patiently wait upon God for instruction, or if I preferred the counsel of my fellow-men to the declarations of the Word of the living God, I made great mistakes."

May we patiently wait upon the Lord for His instruction, preferring it to the counsel of men, through the instrumentality of the Word of God, with honesty of heart, and uprightness before God.

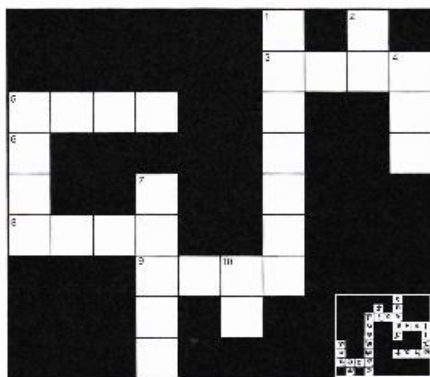

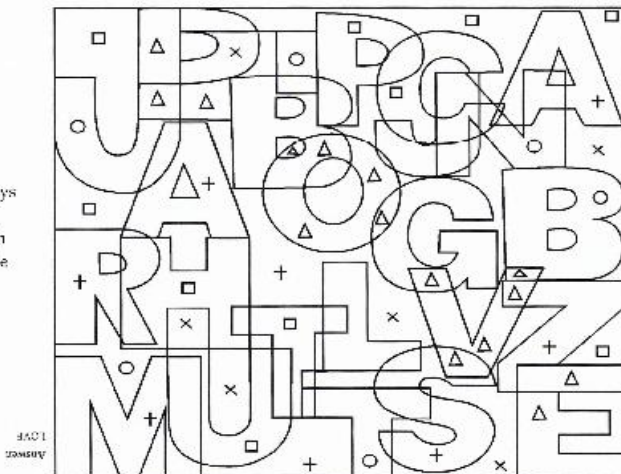

Not too long ago, we heard the tragic news of a young homeless couple who were found dead in their car just outside Ballarat apparently killed by a gas heater they were using to keep warm.

Cliff Barclay, Executive Director of UnitingCare Ballarat said it was not uncommon for people in rural areas to sleep in their cars when they had no alternative. Nor is it uncommon for people to have no alternative - with high unemployment and a public housing shortage causing a spike in the problem.

"It's just a tragic story - iust terrible for young people's lives to end this way,,,he said. „And I think homelessness is going to be a bigger problem for us in the future',.

This devastating story highlights iust how important it is for agencies like unitingCare Ballarat and programs like Breezeway to exist. For some, it could be the difference between life and death - offering connections to community, referrals to services and a welcoming refuge.

Anne Magrath, Coordinator at Breezeway is often warmed by kindnesses that make up the essence of the program. "on a daily basis I am reminded that all those people who support our work and all who have the privilege of being part of the Breezeway family are evidence that true grace is in us all."
